Announcements

Arrival & Dismissal

Student arrival is from 9:00am- 9:15am. Students should not be dropped off or left unattended before 9:00 am. Parent/Guardian is responsible for their child's supervision until the VES school doors open at 9:00am in the morning. If your child has a change in their dismissal plans, please provide VES office staff AND the classroom teacher with this information by sending us an email to <u>vestransportation@hcpss.org</u>. We ask that you make your request no later than 2:00 pm. We will not honor a change in dismissal plans without parental approval. Please indicate the student's name, the date of the transportation change and the details of the transportation change in the email. (ie. will be a car rider instead of bus rider) Early dismissals require you to sign your child/ren out by scanning the QR Code located on the table and near the door bell. Complete the Google Document and be ready to present your ID/License to the secretary. Early dismissals should be requested prior to 3:15pm.

- Please bring your cell phone to scan the QR code.
- Please be prepared to present your Photo ID.
- Please plan accordingly. Students will be dismissed from class upon their parents' arrival and after they have signed the student out from the front office. We cannot have the student dismissed ahead of parent arrival.

Student Absences

Send absent notes to <u>vesabsence@hcpss.org</u> including the child's full name, teacher name and explaining why your child will or was absent. If your child is ill for 5 days or more, you must provide a doctor's note.

<u>Testing</u>

The window for the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) is open through October 10th. This is an observational and assessment tool that provides teachers with information about student readiness for kindergarten. After the assessment window closes, reports will be sent home to families.

Our first graders will be taking their Fall Measures of Academic Program (MAP) assessment the week of September 18th-23rd. Grades 2-5 will be taking their MAP assessments between September26 and October 19th.

Lunch with your child

You must complete the <u>Confidentiality Training Course</u> and <u>Child Abuse and Neglect Training</u>. Return the 2 signed certificates to school. Once completed, sign-up to have lunch with your child using the <u>Reservation Form</u>. No siblings are allowed.

Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment and Intimidation

The Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) is committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for all students. Preventing bullying is an important part of this goal. <u>HCPSS Policy 9460</u> states that bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, and intimidation are prohibited in HCPSS. The BCHI Reporting Form should be used to report all alleged incidents of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, and intimidation that occur at school or have a connection back to the school setting that create a risk of harm to other students while they are at school, or interfere with the educational environment. An <u>online version</u> is available and can easily and confidentially be used by students, staff, and family members. Hard copies of this form are available in the main office, staff workroom, school counseling office, media center, and health services office. If you believe that a student has been bullied, please complete and submit this form as soon as possible.

Once the form is submitted, school administrators will ensure the parent/guardian of both the alleged target and alleged offender are aware of the report and will begin an investigation within two school days of receiving the report. Parents/guardians can expect a school administrator to reach out to them during the investigation. Once the investigation is completed, parents/guardians will be provided written notice of the outcome of the investigation within fifteen days of receiving the compaint, excluding extenuating circumstances.

I want to take a moment to specifically lift up cyberbullying. Cyberbullying is bullying using electronic media like computers, cell phones, and game systems. Our digital interconnectedness makes bullying different and more damaging than it's ever been before. It allows hatred and publicly humiliating gossip or photos to be instantly far-reaching and inescapable as electronic media is everywhere. It can NOT simply be ignored. In October 2013, the State of Maryland enacted Grace's Law, making misuse of interactive computer services a criminal offense. Its purpose is to prohibit anyone from using electronic media (computers, tablets, phones, etc.) to maliciously engage in conduct that inflicts serious emotional distress on a minor and/or places that minor in reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury. A person who is found guilty of violating this law is subject to imprisonment and/or fines. While this will be reviewed with students at school, we are asking you to do the same at home. Thank you for your partnership.

HCPSS Code of Conduct

The HCPSS Student Code of Conduct provides a framework to support behavioral goals and disciplinary policies. All students are expected to be aware of and abide by this Student Code of Conduct. They are designed to foster a sense of belonging and affirm positive behaviors. At Veterans, we implement programs such as social-emotional learning, Positive Behaviors Interventions and Supports (PBIS), and restorative conversations to help teach and reinforce school-appropriate behaviors and build community amongst our students and staff. 

MAMIBasics NAMI Basics

NAMI Basics is a FREE education program for parents and other caregivers of children and adolescents living with mental illness that provides resources and practical insights for families. The NAMI Basics course is taught by trained parents who have lived similar experiences with their own children.

It is not necessary that the child has a specific diagnosis. Caregivers who suspect their child is experiencing symptoms of mental illness can also benefit from the course as they begin to navigate the evaluation and treatment process.

If these dates/times do not work for you, there is also an OnDemand version of the Basics class available at basics.nami.org.

What the course covers

- An introduction to the basics of mental illness, including the biology of mental illness, the challenges of getting an accurate diagnosis, and the latest medical research and advancements in treatment.
- An overview of treatment options for your child.
- Strategies to cope with the impact of a child's illness on the rest of the family, including caring for the caregivers.
- Tools for success e.g., effective communication and problem solving skills, record keeping, and navigating critical support systems (school, mental health care, etc.)

New Student Meals & Payments

New for the 2023-2024 school year, HCPSS no longer will use Nutrislice for school menus or MySchoolBucks for payment. Instead, we have a new parent site for all things food and nutrition. LINQ Connect is a secure, online portal that allows families to make online payments to their child's meal account, monitor their child's account, schedule automatic recurring payments, set up low balance alerts, submit a Free and Reduced Meals program application, and more.

Please note: MySchoolBucks meal balances were automatically transferred to LINQ Connect. If your child had a balance at the end of the 2022-2023 school year, when you add your child to your profile, that meal balance will be displayed.

To request a refund of meal balances at any time, complete this brief online form.

Free and Reduced Meals - check your eligibility today!

Students whose families do not qualify for free or reduced lunch will be required to pay the daily meal price. Many HCPSS families are eligible to participate in the Free and Reduced Price Meals (FARMs) program, which provides children with a wide range of benefits including free or discounted college tuition, testing and application fees, academic and athletic program fees and many others in addition to free or discounted meals. Families are urged to check their eligibility and complete a FARMs application as soon as possible. Families must submit a new application every school year. Details on the Free and Reduced Meals program, including a link to apply, are available online.

Health Services

Health Services information can be found online and will be continually updated. All families, students, staff and visitors should conduct daily health checks prior to entering any HCPSS building and/or school bus. Details, including infection control protocols for communicable diseases like COVID-19, are available online.

Please note that health and safety protocols are subject to change, pending guidance and recommendations from federal, state and local health officials, among other sources.

Opening School Information

The first day of school is Monday, August 28th.

Please work to ensure that your child arrives at school on time. A tardy student must be walked in and signed in by an adult in the front office. If you are dropping your child off at school, consider the car loop traffic as you make your plans for arrival. Students should not be dropped off or let out of your vehicle until 9:00 AM. Supervision is not available for students before this time. Before and after care is available through Howard County Parks and Recreation as well as other before and after school providers in the community.

Arrival and Dismissal

It is important that our students learn the arrival and dismissal procedures, therefore, we highly encourage you to allow your child to arrive and be dismissed from school the same way everyday. There will be staff members outside and inside the building greeting students and helping them to their classrooms. For everyone's safety, please do not walk your child into the building unless you have an appointment with a staff member.

Car riders

We have **new** carloop procedures to share with you. All cars entering the car loop lane are expected to follow the same procedures that are outlined below. **We now have white STOP lines painted on the ground by the bus and car loop area.** A staff member will be at the corner of this area. Please adhere to the staff member's directions for everyone's safety and easy flow of traffic. This year the center aisle in the parking lot will be closed off in order to create a better flow of traffic. Parents should not park in the carloop line or walk their child through moving traffic. Please insist that your child exits and enters your car on **the passenger side only** so that they never cross between cars. There are staff members outside to assist students as needed. Everyone must act with care and patience. Please follow the directions of the staff and kindly abide by our safety practices. Thank you for your support!

Drop off & Pick-up Rules and Courtesies

It is crucial that parents dropping off/picking up students **adhere to the following rules** in order to maintain the highest level of safety for the students and courtesy to those behind you:

- 1. When approaching the carloop, please stay in a single lane (the right lane) until you reach the carloop drop off area. Please do not block the crosswalk.
- 2. Students should exit the vehicle on the passenger side. If a student needs to exit on the driver's side, please ask a staff member for assistance. Please stay in your vehicle.
- 3. Please avoid parking and walking your child to the door unless you have an appointment. The carloop is safer with less pedestrian traffic.
- 4. Mind the gaps. Pull all the way to the end of the loop before loading, out of courtesy to those behind you.
- 5. Remember to stay in your vehicle and ask a staff member if you need help with your child.
- 6. ALWAYS pay attention to what's happening around you and your car!



If you decide to park your car, <u>please park in a parking space</u>. For everyone's safety, please refrain from double parking or blocking the lane in the parking lot. Also, please avoid walking between cars in the carloop.

Safety and courtesy will be maximized **if all drivers** follow these rules. Staff on duty are happy to help your student(s) exit or enter the car.

Bus riders

We highly recommend all students that are eligible for bus transportation ride the bus to and from school in order to reduce traffic in the car loop. Please use the <u>bus locator</u> to determine the specifics on bus stop locations and pick up times for the 2023-2024 school year. The bus locator link will be available in mid-August 2023.
